- to increase global visibility of research from journals published in developing and emerging countries
- to increase capacity of the editors to improve the quality of their journals and manage their journals online
- Collaboration with Public Knowledge Project

What the Project Does

- Provides advice to journals wishing to publish online
- Provides a cost-effective and secure forum for online journals (via a system developed for groups of journals to publish on community websites)
- Thus, increases visibility and accessibility
